Distributive Education is a curriculum designed to offer students interested in obtaining a job immediately after graduation the opportunity to get "on-the-job" training in various commercial businesses. For half a day these students study selling skills and merchandising and then go off to work for the other half of day. This curriculum has opened many doors to our students.



Business and Language play important parts in Swissvale High's curriculum. Business offers such courses as Accounting, Office Machines, Clerical Practice, Typing and Short-hand. These courses are intended for those students interested in some type of secretarial work as a career. Courses also included are Consumer Living, Law, and Distributive Education.

Spanish and French are the languages offered to adventurous students. Both cover a maximum of four years. The students use workbooks, tape recorders, and films along with written and oral dialogues to better understand the language they study.





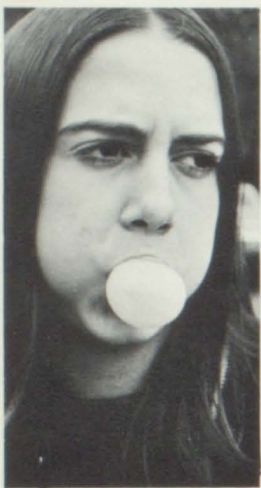

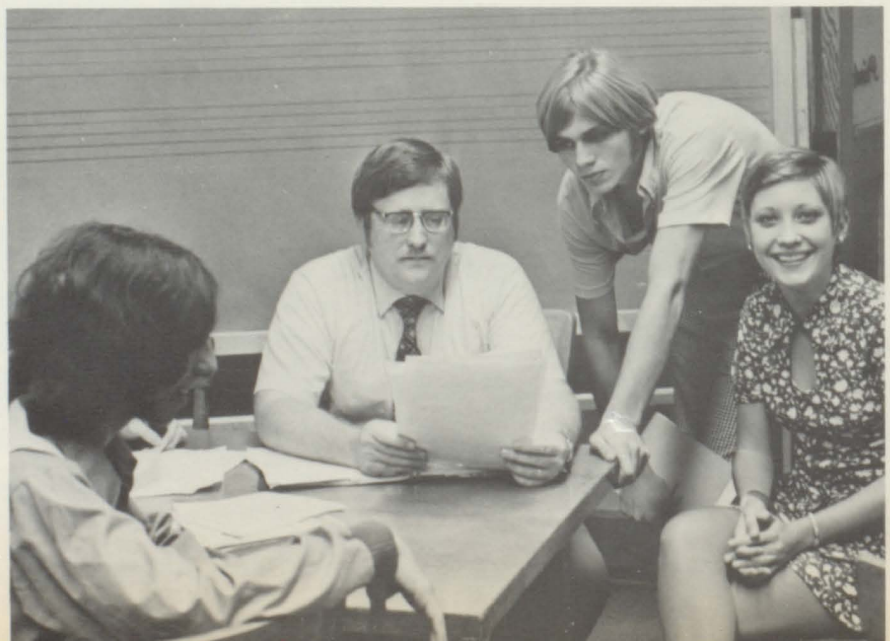
The main function of the Varsity Club is to reward those athletes who excel in sports and to further the spirit of sportsmanship in our High School.

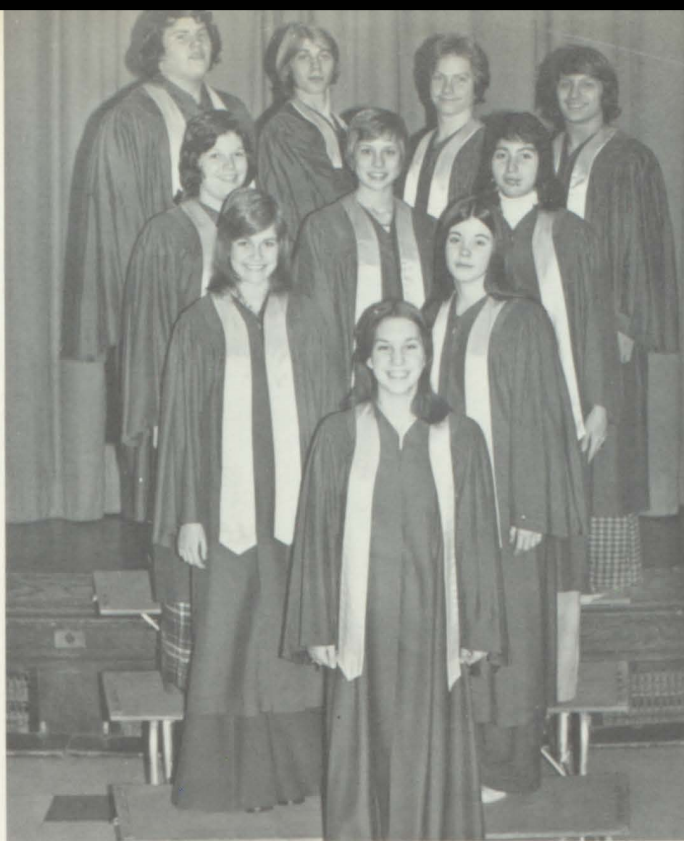

But that was not the only victory. The team proved the Frazier game was no "Flash-in-the-pan" as we edged favored Washington to close out the season.

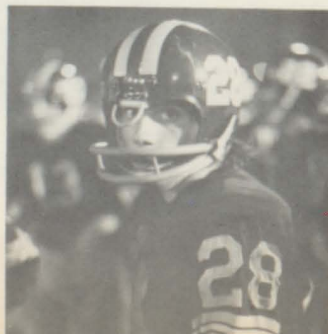
This resurgence belonged to the Seniors, as they came through with remarkable brilliance.

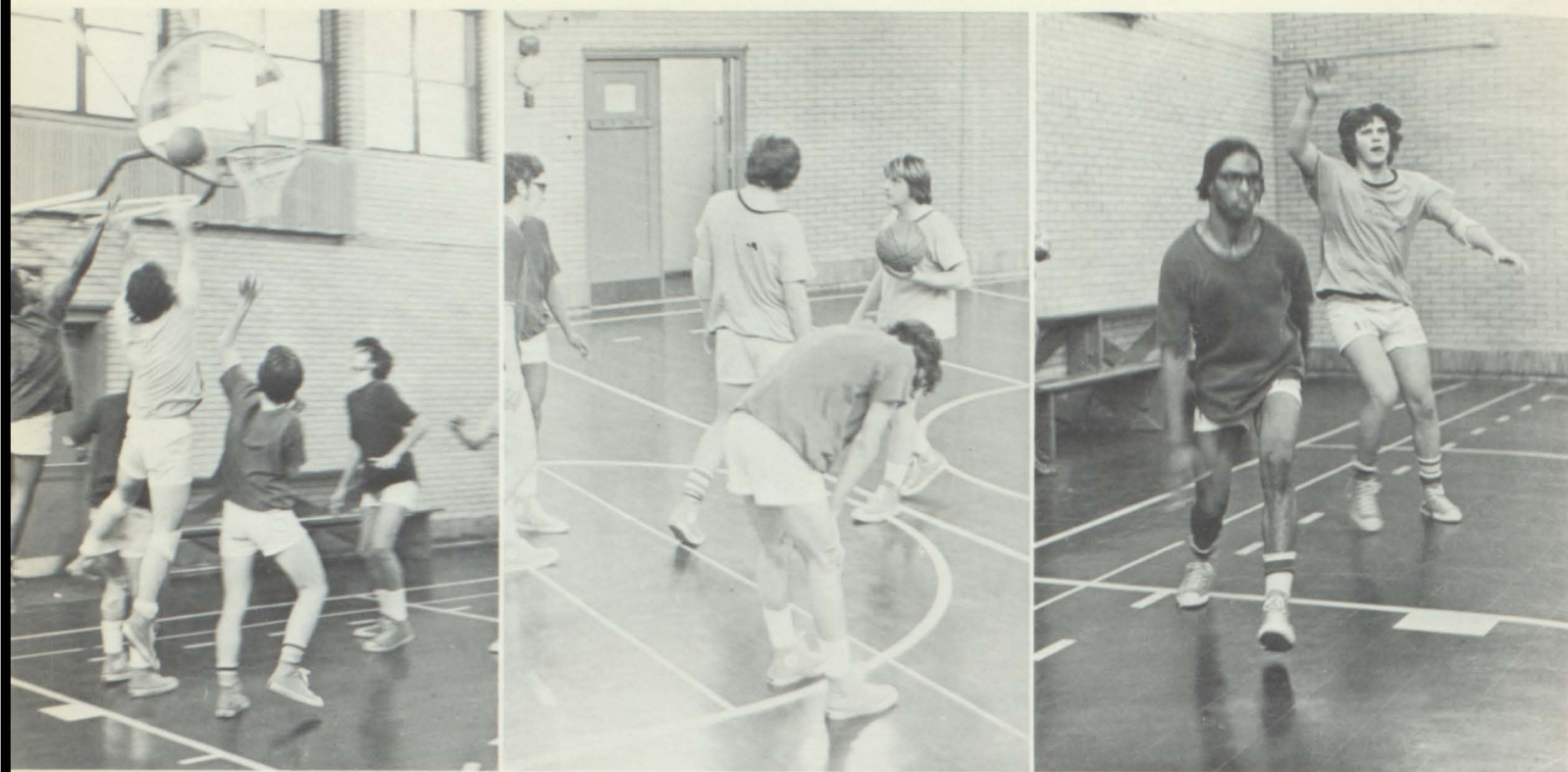

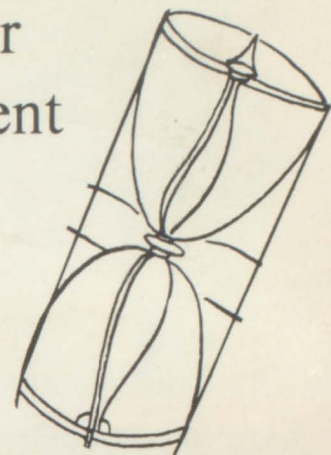
